Recording and editing audio

Activity Overview

It's not enough to simply have a script for voicing a narration. There are best practices that should be used when recording audio, like using a sound proof room and appropriate microphones. In this activity students will learn about preparing to record narrations, how to use and edit sound, combine sounds, and apply crossfades.

Activity Steps

1. Explain that there is more preparation needed than just having a script for recording narrations or voiceovers. There are other practical considerations that need to be made during the audio production phase, like using a sound proof room and appropriate microphones. Introduce this activity by explaining that students will learn about preparing to record narrations, how to use and edit sound, combine sounds, and apply crossfades.
1. Use the *Voicing narrations* and *Selecting and connecting microphones* guides to discuss the items on the checklist for preparing to record narrations and voiceovers. Discuss the need for quiet, sound-absorbing rooms, when recording narrations. Discuss how to create a temporary recording area by doing some of the following:
 - Hang some thick blankets or fiberglass insulation on two adjoining corner walls.
 - Create a four-sided blanketed cubicle.
 - Avoid egg cartons, foam, or carpeting as insulation because they do not absorb sound well.
 - If you hang blankets in only one corner, point the mic toward that corner and have the narrator stand between the mic and the corner.
2. Distribute the technical guides and discuss how to work with natural sound, sounds recorded via a microphone, narrations, and voiceovers. Explain that there will be instances when they will want to combine different sounds. Use the "I do, we do, you do" method to demonstrate how to use the live recording feature in Adobe Premiere Pro.^{2,4}

3. Using the "I do, we do, you do" method, demonstrate how to work with keyframes, adjust audio, and add audio transitions (such as Constant Gain, Constant Power, and Exponential Fade transitions).
Adobe Premiere Pro guide: How to adjust audio and apply crossfades^{4,4}
4. As a class, identify an area to record narrations. Then ask students, individually or in groups, to record a 20-second narration, combining two different sounds and applying a crossfade.
Note: It is recommended that you provide a script, or ask them to recreate a script from a short Public Service Announcement or commercial.
